THE CONDITIONS AT CENTRALIA  
Homeless Cared for Temporarily -- Ruins Smouldering --Rebuilding.

Centralia is slowly recovering from the affects of the awful catastrophe yesterday morning. The homeless are being cared for temporarily in the homes of friends, in the fire engines house, in the St. Ignatius Hall, in club rooms, etc. There are about 150 people in all who must be cared for. Twenty were kept in one family yesterday and the lady of the house was busy at the cook stove all day. Many families could stand this for a day but not much longer and immediate relief is necessary.

This morning yet some of the ruins were still smouldering, but there is no danger of the fire breaking out anew.

Mrs. Rooney has aforce of men at work already clearing away the debris of her property on Locust avenue and starting to build.

The relief committee yesterday sent telegrams to all of the large cities and towns in the state soliciting relief.
